CURRICULUM

Throughout the year we will examine a variety of texts from multiple literary genres. We will particularly be concentrating on the use of literature (through the texts/units listed below) as a tool authors employ to comment upon or criticize society.

Composition also comprises a large portion of the course; in composition the emphasis is on writing clear, unified, coherent essays. There will be both expository and creative writing assignments. In addition, we will be studying vocabulary using the *Sadlier-Oxford Vocabulary Book Level E*.

Texts/Units Include: The Secret Life of Bees by Sue Monk Kidd; The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn by Mark Twain; Lord of the Flies by William Golding; Julius Caesar by William Shakespeare; The Catcher in the Rye by J.D. Salinger; poetry; short stories

Literature Textbook: Prentice Hall Literature: Platinum Level

Textbooks need to be covered. You will be expected to pay for any books not returned to the school.

GRADING

A few notes about grading:

- 1. You should expect that there may be a quiz after any reading assignment. Be prepared!!
- 2. The midterm and final exam are each worth 10% of your grade for the year.
- 3. Major assignments (i.e. certain projects) may count as more than one smaller paper. I will let you know if this is the case.
- 4. Participation and citizenship include your preparedness for class, your attitude, and your willingness to participate in discussions and class activities. If you are consistently prepared for class, on-task, respectful, and participating, the participation/citizenship portion of your grade will be good!

MAKE-UPS/LATE WORK POLICIES

It is *your* responsibility to notify me if you anticipate being absent or if you have been absent. I will save your work for you, but it is in not my responsibility to remind you of missed assignments.

Homework - Late homework may be accepted for half credit. However, at my discretion, there are certain assignments that I do not give half credit for! An example of this would be homework that will specifically be incorporated into the following day's lesson, such as preparing discussion questions about a reading assignment.

Essays - 1 day late: paper loses five points
2 days late: paper loses ten points
3 days late: paper loses 15 points
4 days late: paper loses 20 points
If an essay is more than 4 days late, the highest grade it can receive is a 50.

To be considered on time, essays must be handed in to turnitin.com by the due date and time! More information about turnitin.com will follow.

Quizzes and Tests- Be sure to see me if you are absent on the day of a quiz or test; these must be made up in a timely fashion. Missed quizzes and tests cannot be made up during class time with the exception of reading quizzes. If you miss a reading quiz, you will be expected to take it on the next day that you are in class.

EXPECTATIONS

My expectations are simple:

- 1. Every person in our class deserves to be treated with respect.
- 2. Every person should come to class on time and prepared.
- 3. The classroom needs to be kept clean.
- 4. Everyone will be polite: raise your hand to speak; do not interrupt or talk over others.
- 5. Behavioral expectations and consequences detailed in the handbook will be enforced.

PHONES AND COMPUTERS

Students will be expected to leave their phones in the phone drop provided in the classroom.

You should have your school-issued computer (or your own if you are not using WA's) with you on a daily basis. *Computers should be fully charged every night, and it is expected that you will print your work at home.*

Please don't be late; it is disrespectful. Three tardies in one quarter = one 30 minute detention. After six, you start to lose credit for the course (see student handbook).

Please don't ask to go to the bathroom! Hand signal, take pass, leave. No need to announce.

Vocabulary quizzes will be on Fridays on a biweekly basis. More information about vocabulary will follow!

Essays will need to be turned in to turnitin.com. More information to follow.

MATERIALS

Three ring binder with four sections (suggested): general information, literature, writing, vocabulary/grammar **OR** a notebook and folder to keep important handouts.

Always come to class with your binder/notebook, your chromebook, the current text and something to write with!

ACADEMIC HONESTY
